

9 PATCH –SLICE QUILT BLOCK By Julie Plotniko

12 ¾” FINISHED

CUT THE FOLLOWING:

2 x 4 ¾” squares of white tone on tone 100% cotton

3 x 4 ¾” squares of Dark Pink 100% cotton

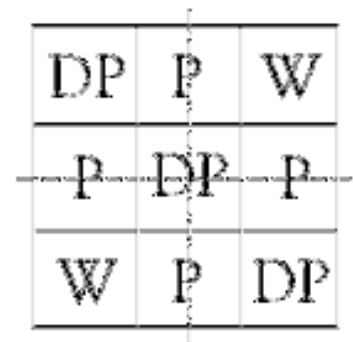
4 x 4 ¾” squares of light Pink 100% Cotton

- DP = Dark Pink
- P = Pink
- W = White

PUTTING IT ALL TOGETHER:

Sew together using a ¼” seam allowance to form a 9 patch block.

This can be done in various ways, layout the 9- 4 ¾” squares in a uniform format like the diagram or sew together in a scrappy manor, which is kind of fun as well. This is your personal choice.



After the 9 patch blocks have been sewn together and pressed, follow the next step that will actually slice this 9 patch block in half vertically and horizontally. Cut down the center of the 9 patch block P/DP/ AND P vertically with your ruler and cutter.

Cut down the center of the 9 patch block P/DP AND P horizontally with your ruler and cutter.

The 9 patch block is now in 4 pieces. Turn the blocks and sew back together. Now we have a 4 patch block that is framed with corner stones and sashing. It is like magic and is so quick.
