PLEASE READ ALL THE WAY TO THE END.**

Donna has adapted the designs from the book "Fresh Picked" by Blackbird Designs for in the hoop machine appliqué. You will use multi-hooping techniques to complete each of the 14 inch blocks. This class is suitable for all makes of embroidery machines with a minimum hoop size of 200 X 300 mm. Class fee includes all designs, instructions and templates. Also includes svg files for those with a digital cutting machine.

<p>Combo Sewing/Embroidery Machine or Sewing Machine and Stand Alone Embroidery Machine and usual embroidery supplies including</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 200 X 300 mm or larger Hoop • Power Cord • Foot control (for sewing the top) • USB stick. Please make sure your USB stick works in your machine! With rapidly changing technology it is impossible for me to predict what size or Brand of USB stick will work in various machines. If your machine did come with a USB stick, bring that one. • Embroidery foot 	
<p>Book: "Fresh Picked" by Blackbird Designs"</p> <p>Please note: Students are required to own a personal copy of this book. Do not rely on the book for your fabric requirements. The class quilt is much smaller than the quilt in the book, due to the limitations of our embroidery machines.</p>	
1.5 m tone on tone fabric for background 1	
1.0 m tone on tone fabric for background 2	

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<p>I used a controlled colour palette for the appliqué on my version of this quilt.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2 greens • 1 gold • 4 reds • 1 brown <p>It is not possible to give exact yardages but I had a least .5 m of each fabric when I started.</p>	
0.5 m fabric 1 for half square triangle border	
0.5 m fabric 2 for half square triangle border	
0.6 m fabric for binding	
3.0 m fabric for backing	
1.5 m (60 X 60 in square) batting	
<p>Fabric for appliqués</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 0.3 m tan01 for large corner flowers and pieced inner border • 0.2 m or scraps tan 02 for large leaves • 0.2 m or scraps white print 02 for small leaves and for corner flower base • 0.2 m or scraps tone on tone tan and corner flower base and for stems • 0.2 or scraps dark navy print for center flower and berries. 	
1.0 m Wonder Under fusible web if you will be cutting your appliqué pieces with a digital cutter.	
<p>Quilters Select Appli-Stick Printer Sheets or OESD Appliqué Fuse and Fix Sheets</p> <p>These help you hand cut your appliqué shapes more accurately than tracing because I can run them through a printer for you</p>	
<p>OESD Ultra Clean and Tear Stabilizer</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Inspira Tear Away</p>	
Machine Embroidery thread to coordinate with appliqué fabrics	
Machine embroidery bobbin thread or pre-wounds	
Janome Red Tip or 90/14 Machine embroidery needles	
Mary Ellen's Best Press (unscented for class use please).	
All purpose thread to match	
6 X 24 ruler, mat and rotary cutter.	
Basic Sewing Supplies: Removable Fabric pen or pencil, seam ripper, pins, etc.	
Sharp scissors for pre-cutting appliqué shapes.	
Mini Iron and Press Surface if using Wonder Under Fusible Web	

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PRE-CLASS PREPARATION

Use Mary Ellen's Best Press to starch all your fabrics.

PREP-CLASS

Do not bring your embroidery machine or embroidery supplies to this class.

Bring your starched and pressed appliqué fabrics. If you are hand cutting your appliqué shapes also bring your printable fusible web sheets, small sharp scissors, pencil, rotary cutter, mat and ruler. Once I have printed your appliqué patterns on your fusible web sheets you can begin cutting out the appliqué shapes.

If you are using a digital cutter to cut your appliqué shapes bring your starched and pressed appliqué fabrics and WonderUnder Fusible Web. Also bring a rotary cutter, mat and ruler. You will be measuring and fusing the WonderUnder to the wrong side of your fabrics for cutting at home.
