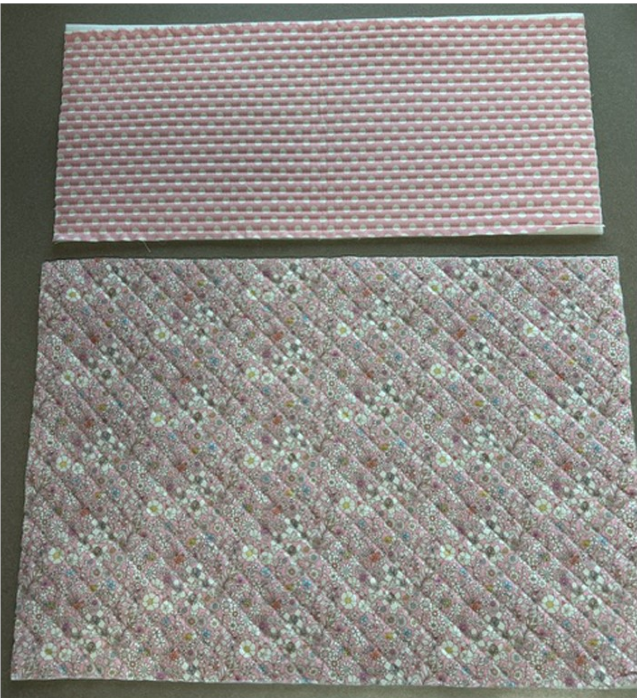
One-of-a-Kind Sneakers with Ron Collins

Now here is a cool and creative way to add to your shoes collection with people saying, “I can’t believe you made them”!!! The European designer sneaker sole kits allow you to create your own quilted pattern that is available in unisex shoe sizes ranging from 36-47 (EU), with the choice of three different sole colours (black/white/natural), three different heights (low/medium/hi-tops) and contrasting fabrics for the shoe, tongue and lining. **Fabric allowances allow for fussy cutting and having more than enough fabric to complete your project.**

<u>Pre-order kit before class from:</u> <u>Fabriculous.com</u> (for sizing and colour choices) which includes: - 1 pair of soles - insoles (which can be replaced with your own orthotics)	Have fun choosing your own creative style when ordering from <u>Fabriculous.com</u>. Allow a generous amount of time to get your sneakers kit before class.
Fabric - .7 m of fabric if you want the same fabric for the shoe, tongue and lining. - .2 m of 3 different fabrics for contrasting shoe, tongue and lining. - 1 m of shape Flex 101 fusible interfacing (available in white & black) - .5 m Soft and Stable	Special Tools - Hemostat or needle nose pliers - Thimble/Silicone Grip - Sewing Clips - Sewing Awl - 505 Spray - Sewing Gauge - Pins - Fabric marking pen - Pencil - Sharp Scissors for notching curves and cutting - Basic sewing Kit
Thread to match fabrics (used for quilting)	
Recommend: Schmetz Microtex 80/12 needles	
Sewing Machine in good working order with basic feet, power cord, foot controller and also bring along a quilting seam bar.	

Fabric should be pre-quilted before class. See page 2 for instructions.

Depending on what style you are making your sneakers in, please complete the following instructions before class.

For sneakers with only one fabric:	For sneakers with contrasting body and togue:
Quilt one 26" x 26" square 	Quilt one 18" x 13" rectangle for the tongue and one 9" x 13" rectangle for the body 

For either style I recommend quilting approximately 1/2" to 3/4" squares
