Machine Embroidery, Broken Star Log Cabin Quilt

with Julie

For all embroidery machines with a 200 x 200 hoop capacity.
 The blocks for this quilt are embroidered and quilted in the hoop, then assembled into a stunning Log Cabin quilt that's sure to become a family heirloom.
 Learn how to: download the designs, transfer them to your embroidery machine, stabilize your fabric, quilt in the hoop, assemble the quilt top, layer and complete your project. I can't wait to see all of the colour variations!

The designs for this project are a free download from CREATIVATE Library.	
Embroidery Machine with power cord, embroidery foot, spare bobbins, foot control and all accessories.	
200 x 200 (or larger) Embroidery Hoop	
Cotton fabric for embroidery: 4.5m	Pre-cut into 64 x 10" squares You will have a few extras for testing.
Binding: .5 m	
Backing: 72" square (3.7m if piecing)	
Batting: 2.1 m of lightweight batting such as Warm and Natural or Hobbs Heirloom 80/20 Plus An additional piece of lightweight batting, 72" x 72" (1.9 m) This will be used to layer the full quilt once the blocks are completed. Hobbs fusible 80/20 works especially well here.	Pre-cut 64 x 10" squares. You will have some extras for testing.
5000 m embroidery thread in your main colour for the log cabin embroidery. It doesn't hurt to have a little extra.	
500 m embroidery thread for the quilting portion of the embroidery design	This can be the same colour as your background fabric or the same as the main colour.

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DecoBob or other similar bobbin thread in a colour to blend with your fabric. White or black is usually fine.	Note* If using pre-wound bobbins, you will need several packages.
<p>The original design instructions are written for salvaged material. As such, the stabilizer used was old bed sheets. I find that this can sometimes be problematic due to the high thread count and the possibility of coloured sheets shadowing through my fabric.</p> <p>I chose to use Husqvarna Whisper Web Mesh – Cut Away stabilizer and it worked beautifully! You will need at least 3 rolls, depending on your hoop size.</p>	<p>Additional Supplies</p> <p>A pair of sharp, curved scissors for trimming away the excess batting.</p> <p>A sewing stiletto is helpful for assembling the blocks.</p> <p>A USB stick to transfer the designs to your machine.</p>

Sewing Machine: Please bring your embroidery machine to class in good working order with full accessories, embroidery unit (if separate), manual, extra bobbins, power cord, foot control, all applicable hoops, embroidery foot, 1/4 foot, walking foot, and a USB stick.

Basic Sewing Kit: Rotary cutter, ruler & mat, scissors, seam ripper, press sheet, pins (safety and straight), thread, thread snips, fabric marker of choice.

Note: Please bring your laptop and Mouse if you would like to practice transferring the designs. Free CREATIVATE membership required.
